DEA Compliance, Record Keeping and Pharmacy Due Diligence

- Explain the responsibilities placed by the United States Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General on the various Pharmacy Benefit Managers, the Medicare Prescription Drug program administrators and the Medicare Advantage Prescription Drug program administrators in their oversight of pharmacies billing activities for occasions of Fraud, Waste and Abusive billing practices.
